

DRACAENA DORADO Dracaena deremensis

The Dracaena Dorado is a low-maintenance evergreen that tolerates a wide range of growing conditions. Featuring dark-green leaves with lime-green edges, the Dracaena Dorado is a lush houseplant in spaces where natural sunlight may be limited. The Dracaena Dorado is especially good at removing formaldehyde and other toxins from the air.

GREAT FOR: Low Sunlight

FEATURES:

Low-maintenance

GROWTH RATE: Slow



LIGHT

Medium, indirect sunlight is best but can tolerate low light as well. New growth may be smaller in low light. Avoid direct sunlight.



DIFFICULTY

Easy! Just avoid direct sun and don't overwater.



FERTILIZER

Feed with a liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about once a month during the growing season. Do not fertilize in winter.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune top foliage to maintain desired height. Can cut tall stalks and new growth will appear near the cut. Major cuts in early spring. Trim brown tips with wet scissors. To propagate, use rooting hormone on stem cuttings in summer.







Allow soil to mostly dry out, and water less often in winter. Water less if in low light. If brown tips occur on foliage, try filtered/ distilled water.



TEMPERATURE

Tolerates a wide range of temperatures, but prefers 60-85°F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



Use a well-draining, All-Purpose potting soil. Can mix soil with lava rocks to improve drainage.
