

CALATHEA RATTLESNAKE Calathea lancifolia

Performing best in bright indirect sunlight, the Calathea Rattlesnake produces green leaves with spotted patterns and purple undersides. Here it is planted in a matte-white ceramic pot. Check the soil for dampness once a week. If dry, add about a cup of water, keeping in mind that any excess will build up in the bottom and should be avoided.

GREAT FOR: Low Sunlight

FEATURES: Pet-Friendly

GROWTH RATE: Slow



LIGHT

Prefers bright, indirect light but can tolerate low light as well. Avoid direct sunlight.



LEVEL OF CARE

Easy! Just avoid direct sunlight and don't overwater.



FERTILIZER

Feed with a mild liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about once a month during the growing season. Do not fertilize in winter.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune yellow or damaged leaves down to stem. To propagate, large plants can be divided in the spring.







WATER

Prefers soil to partially dry out so check about once a week. Thrives in an environment with high humidity. Water less in winter when plant is dormant.



TEMPERATURE

Prefers warm conditions 65-80F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



SOIL

A peaty All-Purpose potting soil with good drainage works best.
