

SILVER LACE FERN *Low light, easy to care for*

Silver Lace ferns perform best in bright indirect or low sunlight. The plants produce delicate fronds with jagged-edged leaves. Here it is planted in a matte-white ceramic pot. Check the soil for dampness once a week. If dry, add about a cup of water, keeping in mind that any excess will build up in the bottom and should be avoided.

GREAT FOR: Low Sunlight**FEATURES:**

Great for interior spaces

GROWTH RATE: Moderate**LIGHT**

As houseplants, bright indirect or filtered light is best.

**WATER**

Keep evenly moist but not saturated and mist to increase humidity.

**LEVEL OF CARE**

Needs a little extra care. Just be sure the plant has enough humidity and that it is not in too much sunlight.

**TEMPERATURE**

Prefers warm and humid climates. Keep above 60F.

**FERTILIZER**

Feed with a liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about once every 2 weeks during the growing season. Do not fertilize in winter.

**SOIL**

Plant in well-draining organic-rich soil.

**PRUNING & PROPAGATION**

Prune yellowed or brown leaves down to stem. To propagate, split plant in spring and repot.

**PET FRIENDLY?**

Yes! Generally, ferns are non-toxic to dogs and cats.
