

MARBLE PEPEROMIA *Peperomia obtusifolia*

A Marble Peperomia with spoon-shaped leaves is planted in a cream-glazed ceramic pot. Place in bright indirect light or a space that receives a few hours of morning sun. Check the soil for dampness once a week. If dry, add about a cup of water, keeping in mind that any excess will build up in the bottom and should be avoided. Also avoid cold drafts for best results.

LIGHT

Prefers bright, indirect light but can tolerate low light as well. Avoid direct sunlight.



LEVEL OF CARE

Easy! Just avoid direct sunlight and don't overwater.



FERTILIZER

Feed with a mild liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about once a month during the growing season. Do not fertilize in winter.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune yellow or damaged leaves down to stem. Periodic pruning will keep plants looking bushy. To propagate, dip stem cuttings with leaves in rooting hormone and repot in a warm environment.



WATER

Prefers soil to partially dry out so check about once a week. Thrives in a moist environment with high humidity. Water less in winter when plant is dormant.



TEMPERATURE

Prefers warm conditions 65-80F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



SOIL

Prefers soil to partially dry out so check about once a week. Thrives in a moist environment with high humidity. Water less in winter when plant is dormant.
