LIGHT

Prefers bright, indirect light but can tolerate low light as well. Avoid direct sunlight.



DIFFICULTY

Easy! Just avoid direct sun and don't overwater.



FERTILIZER

Feed with a liquid, indoor plant fertilizer about once a month during the growing season. Do not fertilize in winter.



PRUNING & PROPAGATION

Prune damaged or yellow leaves by cutting to the stem base. To propagate, place stem cuttings with leaves in water until ready to repot.







\M/ATER

Prefers soil to partially dry out between waterings so check about once a week.



TEMPERATURE

Prefers warm conditions 65-80°F. Keep away from drafty windows and air conditioners.



SOIL

A peaty All-Purpose potting soil with good drainage works best.



PET FRIENDLY?

Sorry! Plant contains very sharp calcium oxalate crystals that, when eaten, cause mouth and digestion irritation.
